



## Rustic Light-up Star Decor

### Supply List:

- 12x12 unfinished wood board (CAL-272)
- 11" Silver 3-d star (318-70151)
- Led lights 20 ct cool white battery operated (SIE 822)
- Folk Art Milk Paint color: New England Red
- Chalky Paint color: Everlasting
- Foam Brush
- Foam Wedge
- Drill and 3/16" Drill bit
- Glue Gun
- Sanding Block
- 12x12 scrapbook paper



### Directions:

1. Draw a 11 3/4" circle (I used a bowl, but you can use a lid or anything circular)
2. Cut your circle out, then fit star on the center of the paper and draw your metal star so you can plan where your hole will go for the lights.
3. Draw 18 dots around your circle where your going to drill, keep in mind the sides of your board is about 1/4" and you don't want your holes going into the side panel of the board.
4. Drill 18 holes then sand lightly so holes aren't rough.
5. Then paint board using milk paint. I only needed one coat.
6. While your board is drying paint your star white with chalky paint using a sponge and lightly dabbing paint on to star. I did 2 coats and let it dry completely before second coat.
7. Place lights through the hole from back to front starting at the bottom hole. To hold lights in place use your glue gun on the back side of the board, placing glue over the back of the light cord.
8. Hold light in place till glue dries. (hint: I used a mini fan to speed up the process)
9. Repeat for the rest of the lights.
10. Once star has dried lightly sand and attach it to board by hanging it with a nail.
