



Jumbo Brioche Scarf

Who knew you could create a wearable work of art by casting on only six stitches? A surprisingly simple brioche stitch heightens the beauty of 3 Sisters Yarn for a sumptuous heirloom effect.



Intermediate / Intermédiaire / Intermedio

Materials

Three Sisters Yarn in the color Sandstone, 3 hanks.

Needles: US Size 35 (19 mm)

Gauge

2.5 stitches and 3.5 rows = 4" when worked in brioche stitch. Gauge is not critical for this project.



Finished Size

9" (23 cm) wide by 91" (231 cm) long



Recomendations

You may wish to use size 50 knitting needles if you tend to knit tightly.

Abbreviations

- YO = yarn over
- S = slip 1 stitch purlwise
- CO = cast on
- BO = bind off
- BK2tog = brioche knit 2 together (knit yo and slipped stitch together)



Step 01
CO 6 stitches.



Step 02
Set up row:
YO, S, K1; YO, S, K1;
YO, S, K1.

Step 03
YO, S, BK2tog; YO, S,
BK2tog; YO, S,
BK2tog.
Repeat this row to
form pattern.
Continue until scarf
is desired length.
Bind off row: K1,
K2tog, bind off 1;
repeat to end of
row.
Cut yarn. Weave in
ends.

Recap

You may wish to use practice yarn (as we have, above) to get the hang of the brioche stitch, before using the larger yarn and needles. Remember, it takes a few rows before a pattern emerges.
