



NO-SEW MONSTER PILLOWS

Supplies:

WEREWOLF

- 1- 12 x 16 pillow insert
- 2 - 9 x 12 craft cuts of brown fur OR 1 fat quarter of a fluffy/long style of cuddle fleece.
- 1 - 12 x 18 cut of brown wool felt
- 2-2" scraps of white felt
- 1 pair 35mm googly eyes

MUMMY

- 1- 12 x 16 pillow insert
- 1 pack of cheese cloth (Optional, two packs will give better coverage and make a mummy with more bandages!)
- 1 pair 4" googly eyes

OOGY BOOGY

- 1- 12 x 16 pillow insert
- 1 - half yard cut of burlap
- 1 - 12 x 18 cut of black wool felt
- 1 skein black yarn
- 1 yarn needle

GENERAL SUPPLIES FOR ALL MONSTERS:

Hot glue gun with extra glue sticks

We recommend a set of silicon finger tip cover (available in adhesive aisle) to protect your fingers. Hot glue tends to move through fabric and "get" you when you least expect it!

ASSEMBLY *All done with the hot glue gun unless otherwise stated

Werewolf:

1. Glue brown wool felt to the back of the pillow, covering it completely from edge to edge.
2. Cover the top half of the pillow front with brown fur,
3. Cut two lower fangs out of the white felt scraps. Glue them to the pillow directly below the brown fur, so the teeth overlap the bottom edge of the fur.
4. Cover the bottom half of the pillow with fur, right up to the edge of the previous piece from step 2. (Note- the fangs will stick out in between to the two pieces to create a closed mouth with an under bite)
5. Decide where you want your eyes to be. Gently part the fur in each spot and glue the eyes in place.

Mummy:

1. Hot glue google eyes directly to the pillow.
2. On the back of the pillow, secure one corner of the cheese cloth with hot glue (Here's where you're going to want those finger guards!)
3. Wind, wrap and fold the cheese cloth around the pillow. It works best if you overlap the eyes just a bit at the top and bottom. Secure the end on the back side with glue.

Oogy Boogy

1. Fold burlap in half around pillow form so that most of the extra hangs off the top of the pillow.
2. Cut the top left corner off of the front and back layers of the burlap in a large curve shape.
3. Fold in about an inch of the raw edges and use black yarn and a yarn needle to wrap the edges with yarn, all the way around.
4. Cut out eyes and mouth from wool felt and glue in place.
5. Fold, wrinkly, and "scrunch" the hat down on one side. Use small dots of hot glue to secure each fold in place.
